If you don't have a Highland Creek ID yet, or need a replacement card, now is the time to get it!

Please note the following:

- O IDs are taken at the Highland Creek Sports Club office by appointment only Monday - Friday 10:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m.; Saturday and Sunday 10:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m. Hours may differ due to COVID-19. Please check HighlandCreek.com for upto-date hours. Call The Sports Club at 704-766-0045 for an appointment.
- O Everyone five years and older needs to have an ID card.
- O You must bring your closing papers or rental agreement and a photo ID when coming for your first ID card.
- O If you move from one house to another within Highland Creek, you must bring your closing papers or lease for the new house so that your address can be updated. Please do not throw away your ID cards from the previous house. The cards will be made active for your new address.
- O If you lose your ID and need a replacement, you will need a photo ID and proof of residency such as a utility bill. There is a \$10.00 charge for replacement cards.
- O Cards do not need to be updated unless you move. If you want to update your child's card there will be a \$10.00 charge until such time as they are able to go to the pool on their own (12 yrs. old).
- O Your ID card is valid only if Association assessments are paid and up to date.
- O ID cards are for residents only. If you own a home but lease it to someone else, the lessee is entitled to the cards.
- O Highland Creek Security has the authority to ask to see proof of residence. Please carry your Highland Creek ID badge with you when using any of the amenities including parks and playgrounds.




Kick Off the Summer Pool Party

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
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
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Teen Fitness Room Policy

- Come to the Sports Club accompanied by a parent or guardian with proper ID. Both parties must review and sign the Authorization/Contract in front of a Sports Club employee.
- 3. The Sports Director will schedule a session for instruction on the fitness room equipment.
- 4. Present a valid ID Card at the Sports Club desk. No teens will be admitted to the Fitness Center on his/her own without showing the valid Fitness Center ID, NO EXCEPTIONS! If they lose the ID they will have to pay \$10.00 for a replacement.
- If the teen is disruptive or does not follow the rules he/she will
 have one warning; if it happens again, his/her ID will not be
 returned to him/her. He/she will not be permitted back in the
 Fitness Center.







Guidelines for Clubhouse Rentals



- Clubhouse reservations are handled by staff at the Sports Club. Please call the Sports Club at 704-766-0045.
- You must be a Highland Creek resident and association dues must be current in order to reserve the facility.
- * The clubhouses cannot be used for any business, religious, charity or commercial purpose.
- Prosperity Park rental fee is \$100 with a damage/non-compliance deposit of \$500. A check for \$50 must be submitted with the contract to hold your reservation. The balance of \$550 must be paid by certified check or money order no later than 30 days before the event. Make check payable to HCCA.
- Sports Club rental fee is \$200 with a damage/non-compliance deposit of \$500. A check for \$50 must be submitted with the contract to hold your reservation. The balance of \$650 must be paid by certified check or money order no later than 30 days before the event. Make check payable to HCCA.
- > \$50 is non-refundable if your party is cancelled.
- NO cash payments will be accepted.
- Rental contracts/fee/deposit must be dropped off at the Sports Club.
- Reservations may be booked up to six months in advance on a "first come, first served" basis.
- $\boldsymbol{\nsim}$ Reservations must be made at least 2 weeks prior to the event.
- If consumption of alcohol will be permitted, proof of \$1,000,000 personal liability limit insurance or umbrella policy must be received no later than 14 days before event.

- One adult must accompany every 5 persons under 21 years of age.
- Time slots available for rentals are 11-5pm and 6-midnight. The six hour rental includes your set-up and clean-up.
- The Sports Club has 10 six foot long tables, 4 card tables and approximately 70 chairs for your use. It also has a full kitchen, sound system, and smart TV.
- Prosperity Park has 6 square tables with 4 chairs each, 1 long table with 6 chairs and approximately 20 extra chairs. It also has a kitchen with microwave & refrigerator.
- Capacity of the Sports Club is approx. 80 people and Prosperity Park Clubhouse is approx. 50.
- If renting Prosperity Park clubhouse for a pool party, wet bathing suits are not allowed in the clubhouse. Guests must be completely dried off.
- Helium balloons, bounce houses, game trucks and grills are not allowed.
- If you are found in violation of the contract, deposit monies will NOT be returned
- Please bring your Highland Creek ID card with you to the Sports Club when filling out the rental contract.

Strengthen Your 'Three-Legged Stool' for Retirement...submitted by Daniel Haller

For many years, Americans provided for their retirement needs through three sources: employer-sponsored

pension plans, Social Security income, and savings and investments accumulated through employer plans or individual accounts - the

so-called "three-legged stool." But today, that stool is shakier than it used to be. What can you do to strengthen it?

To begin with, all three legs of the stool are facing challenges. Let's consider them:

- Employer pensions A generation ago, workers employed in many companies could count on a set monthly pension income to help them through their retirement years. Today, pensions -also known as defined benefit plans - are mostly found in public sector employment, as most privatesector employers have replaced their pensions with 401(k) and similar plans. These plans can be quite effective at helping build resources for retirement, but they do place most of the responsibility for saving on the employee.
- **Social Security** Social Security has come under financial pressure because the workers-to-retirees ratio has declined significantly, according to the Social Security Administration's 2021 Board of Trustees Report. A number of proposals have been brought forward on how to improve the long-term financial security of the Social Security system.
- Personal savings and investments In terms of building savings and investments for retirement, the picture is somewhat mixed. The national savings rate has increased in recent years, but more than half of American workers still say their retirement savings are not where they should be, according to a 2021 survey from Bankrate, a personal finance website. And the same survey found that just over half of investors with a 401(k) or IRA have taken early withdrawals – that is, they withdrew money before they retired. Furthermore, we may be waiting too long even to begin saving/investing for retirement. A survey from

Age Wave and Edward Jones found that respondents began saving for retirement at an average age of 38. but the majority said they should have started saving a decade earlier.

You have options for improving some parts of your own three-legged stool. For example, no matter what happens to Social Security, you can still decide when to start taking payments. You can begin collecting benefits as early as 62, but your monthly checks will be larger if you wait until your "full" retirement age, which will likely be between 66 and 67. You can even delay taking benefits until they "max out" at age 70.

As for a pension, you can't control what's available to you through your employer, but you can create your own retirement income stream by contributing as much as you can afford to your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored plan and by increasing your contributions wheneveryour salary goes up. And you can also contribute to an IRA or other investment vehicle to further boost your retirement funds. Try to leave these accounts intact until you need them for retirement. This will be easier if you've built an emergency fund, with the money kept in a liquid, lowrisk account, to pay for unexpected costs, such as those resulting from a major car or home repair.

The three-legged stool may not be as universal as it once was - but you can still construct a sturdy structure to support your retirement needs in the future.

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

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Hide Your Trash Cans

Many new residents have moved into the community over the spring and summer and are not aware of the proper storage location of garbage cans. The Highland Creek governing documents state that all garbage cans should be stored or screened such that they are not visible from the street or neighboring houses. Residents may 1) relocate the storage of the garbage can such that it is not visible (garage is preferred), 2) screen it with mature plant material, or 3) screen it by constructing an approved lattice enclosure (call Hawthorne Management for specifications and drawing of this enclosure).

A Few Quick Tips and Reminders

1. Prior approval is needed from the Modifications Committee if installing a fence or making a change to the exterior of the home (i.e., painting, roof replacement, driveway addition, solar panel install, tree removal, etc).

2. Sidewalks in the community are maintained by the City of Charlotte or Concord; any repairs can be reported by calling 311 or
