

Please note the following:

- O Everyone five years and older needs to have an ID card.
- O You must bring your closing papers or rental agreement and a photo ID when coming for your first ID card.
- O If you move from one house to another within Highland Creek, you must bring your closing papers or lease for the new house so that your address can be updated. Please do not throw away your ID cards from the previous house. The cards will be made active for your new address.
- O If you lose your ID and need a replacement, you will need a photo ID and proof of residency such as a utility bill. There is a \$10.00 charge for replacement cards.
- O Cards do not need to be updated unless you move. If you want to update your child's card there will be a \$10.00 charge until such time as they are able to go to the pool on their own (12 yrs. old).
- O Your ID card is valid only if Association assessments are paid and up to date.
- O ID cards are for residents only. If you own a home but lease it to someone else, the lessee is entitled to the cards.
- O Highland Creek Security has the authority to ask to see proof of residence. Please carry your Highland Creek ID badge with you when using any of the amenities including parks and playgrounds.

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
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Teen Fitness Room Policy

- 2. Come to the Sports Club accompanied by a parent or guardian with proper ID. Both parties must review and sign the Authorization/Contract in front of a Sports Club employee.
- 3. The Sports Director will schedule a session for instruction on the fitness room equipment.
- 4. Present a valid ID Card at the Sports Club desk. No teens will be admitted to the Fitness Center on his/her own without showing the valid Fitness Center ID, NO EXCEPTIONS! If they lose the ID they will have to pay \$10.00 for a replacement.
- If the teen is disruptive or does not follow the rules he/she will

 returned to him/her. He/she will not be permitted back in the

Guidelines for Clubhouse Rentals



- Clubhouse reservations are handled by staff at the Sports Club. Please call the Sports Club at 704-766-0045.
- You must be a Highland Creek resident and association dues must be current in order to reserve the facility.
- The clubhouses cannot be used for any business, religious, charity or commercial purpose.
- ➢ Prosperity Park rental fee is \$100 with a damage/non-compliance deposit of \$500. A check for \$50 must be submitted with the contract to hold your reservation. The balance of \$550 must be paid by certified check or money order no later than 30 days before the event. Make check payable to HCCA.
- ➢ Sports Club rental fee is \$200 with a damage/non-compliance deposit of \$500. A check for \$50 must be submitted with the contract to hold your reservation. The balance of \$650 must be paid by certified check or money order no later than 30 days before the event. Make check payable to HCCA.
- ♦ \$50 is non-refundable if your party is cancelled.
- NO cash payments will be accepted.
- Rental contracts/fee/deposit must be dropped off at the Sports Club.
- Reservations may be booked up to six months in advance on a "first come, first served" basis.
- $\boldsymbol{\nsim}$ Reservations must be made at least 2 weeks prior to the event.
- If consumption of alcohol will be permitted, proof of \$1,000,000 personal liability limit insurance or umbrella policy must be received no later than 14 days before event.

- > One adult must accompany every 5 persons under 21 years of age.
- Time slots available for rentals are 11-5pm and 6-midnight. The six hour rental includes your set-up and clean-up.
- The Sports Club has 10 six foot long tables, 4 card tables and approximately 70 chairs for your use. It also has a full kitchen, sound system, and smart TV.
- Prosperity Park has 6 square tables with 4 chairs each, 1 long table with 6 chairs and approximately 20 extra chairs. It also has a kitchen with microwave & refrigerator.
- Capacity of the Sports Club is approx. 80 people and Prosperity Park Clubhouse is approx. 50.
- If renting Prosperity Park clubhouse for a pool party, wet bathing suits are not allowed in the clubhouse. Guests must be completely dried off.

White Bean Chicken Chili

- 1 small yellowonion, diced
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 2 cloves garlic, finely minced
- 2 (14.5 oz) cans low-sodium chicken broth
- 1 (7 oz) can diced green chilies
- 1 1/2 tsp cumin
- 1/2 tsp paprika
- 1/2 tsp dried oregano
- 1/2 tsp ground coriander
- 1/4 tsp cayenne pepper
- salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- 1 (8 oz) pkg neufchatel cheese (aka light cream cheese), cut into small cubes
- 1 1/4 cup frozen or fresh corn
- 2 (15 oz) cans cannellini beans
- 2 1/2 cups shredded cooked rotisserie or left-over chicken
- 1 tbsp fresh lime juice

serving (optional)

2 tbsp chopped fresh cilantro, plus more for serving Tortilla chips or strips, monterrey jack cheese, sliced avacado for



Instructions:

Heat olive oil in a large pot over medium-high heat. Add onion and saute 4 minutes. Add garlic and saute 30 seconds longer

Add chicken broth, green chilies, cumin, paprika, oregano, coriander, cayenne pepper and season with salt and pepper to taste. Bring mixture just to

a boil then reduce heat to medium-low and simmer 15 minutes.

Drain and rinse beans in a fine mesh strainer or colander then measure out 1 cup. Set whole beans aside, transfer 1 cup beans to a food processor along with 1/4 cup broth fromsoup, puree until nearly smooth*.

Add neufchatel cheese to soup along with corn, whole beans and pureed beans and stir well. Simmer 5-10 minutes longer.

Stir in chicken, fresh lime juice and cilantro. Serve with monterrey jack cheese, more cilantro, avocado slices and tortilla chips if desired.

*If you don't own a food processor you can skip the pureeing step, soup ust won't be as creamy.











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

What should Alzheimer's caregivers know?...submitted by Daniel Haller



diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease, or is starting to show symptoms, you will face some cope with your emotions. But you can at least address some of the financial issues involved to

help give yourself a greater sense of control.

Here are some moves to consider:

• Plan for care costs and identify insurance coverage. The list of Alzheimer's-related medical expenses is long and includes ongoing medical treatment, medical equipment, home safety modifications, prescription drugs and personal care supplies. As a caregiver, you'll want to know the extent of your loved one's health insurance: Medicare, supplemental policies, veteran's benefits if applicable, and so on. One big question is how much coverage they might have for adult day care services, in-home care services and full-time residential care services, and other long-term care options. Long-term care is one of the largest health care costs not covered by Medicare, so you'll want to determine if your loved one has a long-term care policy or another insurance policy with a long-term care rider.

- Identify assets and debts. You'll need to know your family member's financial position, both what they own — bank accounts, investments, property, etc. — and what they owe, such as credit card debt, a mortgage, lines of credit, and so on. This knowledge will be essential if you're granted power of attorney to take over your loved one's finances.
- Look for tax breaks available to caregivers. If you're a caregiver, you may have to pay for some care costs out of pocket. Consequently, you could receive some tax credits and deductions. These benefits vary by state, so you'll want to consult with your tax advisor to determine your eligibility.

It's important to have these and other necessary documents drawn up before someone is diagnosed with Alzheimer's or when they're just starting to exhibit the earliest signs of the disease, so they can understand what documents they are signing. If you wait until they no longer have this cognitive ability, things will get much more challenging. You could apply to become a conservator, which grants decision-making abilities similar



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

Fall Turf Restoration <u>Reminder</u>

Highland Creek has always taken great pride in the standard of lawn care exhibited by the majority of its residents. Thank you to those residents who have treated the weeds in your lawn and are planning to re-seed and fertilize this fall. Please note that owners are expected to maintain their yards at minimal and realistic standards. These

- Cut the grass on a regular schedule to maintain a maximum height of 5".
- Pull or kill the weeds.
- Trim the grass, weeds and groundcover off the sidewalk and driveway.
- Mow to eliminate grass head seed (sprouting).
- Mow the grass between the sidewalk and street.

It is important for you to take diligent steps in the fall to restore the health and attractiveness of your lawn. Talk with your landscape maintenance company, gather information on the process for turf restoration or talk with a professional at a garden center for guidance. Helpful information concerning care maintenance/

renovation can also be found on the HOA website by clicking on the "HOA Info" tab and "Landscaping". The **Covenants Committee strongly** urges you to aerate and seed/ sod your lawn in the fall in order to experience healthy turf restoration. Thank you in advance for doing your part to restore the high standard of lawn care that Highland Creek is working to maintain.

All garbage and recycle containers and other similar items must be

screenedfrom view of the street except for when placed at the curb for pick up. Please do not place these items at the curb any sooner than the day before pick up.

- Homeowner's wishing to sell or lease their homes are entitled to put one (1) "For Sale" sign or (1) "For Lease" sign of standard size in their yard.
- No garage sale, moving sale, rummage auction or similar activity may be conducted in any Unit; this includes "estate sales."
- One Vendor Sign is allowed in the front yard while the work is actively in progress
- on the property. Any changes to the exterior of the home or lot require prior approval the Modifications Committee. Examples of residents include exterior painting, installation of a fence, pergola, solar panels, sunroom, deck, patio, roof replacement and tree removal.

Holiday Decorations

It may seem early for this topic, but holiday decorations were in the stores before Labor Day. The governing documents

state that, "Holiday decorations are acceptable but must not be in place more than 30 days prior to an event and must be removed 15 days after an event." Please be aware of this restriction and plan your holiday decorating within this guideline. Also, do not dispose of your holiday wreaths and/or trees by dumping them in neighborhood creeks. The dead trees block the creeks,

resulting in standing water that becomes stagnant and causes damage to property along the creeks. You may place your holiday trees street side and the City of Charlotte/Concord will dispose of them properly at no extra charge to you.

White Rocks

Please do not install white

rocks as ground cover or as a substitute for mulch. The Association will not permit rocks lighter in color than an earthen hue. If you are in doubt, submit your request, complete with a sample of color, to the Association through

Management Hawthorne Company.

Removal of Trash Containers from Curbside

Please be mindful that Charlotte Mecklenburg Ordinance states any customer who places solid waste at curbside prior to the day before the scheduled collection date or who fails to remove solid waste and/or containers from curbside by midnight on the day of collection may be issued a civil penalty in the amount of \$50.00. If you live in Concord, please note that Cabarrus County Ordinance states you are allowed to place your waste curbside after 5:00 p.m. the evening before your scheduled collection day, and containers must be removed from the curb by 9:00 p.m. on your collection day. Leaving your container at the curb after your collection day may result in code enforcement penalties in Mecklenburg and Cabarrus County.

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
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
